



Alpine Waste & Recycling

It was a big day for Alpine Waste & Recycling Company and a big day for Adams County when on Wednesday, September 12, 2007 Alpine unveiled their new high-tech recycling plant at 645 53rd Place in unincorporated Adams County.

The 'Grand Opening' ceremonies included tours of the plant, a BBQ and visits from dignitaries, namely Adams County Commissioner Alice J. Nichol, Executive Director of Colorado Association for Recycling Marjorie Griek and Alpine Waste & Recycling President John Griffith. Commissioner Nichol said that Adams County is pro-business and we welcome this 'major project' to our area. Director Griek stated "The Colorado Association for Recycling appreciates all steps the industry takes in making recycling an easier process for all consumers. Alpines new recycling plant could be a key component in the campaign to invigorate those efforts". President Griffith stated "Prior to the opening of this plant, Alpine and its customers had been at the mercy of a single operator in the Denver area. Today with Altogether Recycling we begin to enjoy the benefits of the American System of market competition".

The 31,000-square foot plant is equipped with the most modern equipment that allows customers to combine their recyclable materials "all together" in a single stream. The plant offers the first opportunity for third-party waste haulers to get a competing price on service known in the industry as "single stream" recycling. The Alpine plant currently has capacity to process 10,000 tons of recyclables per month, with options for expansion. Those operations alone save 93,000 trees and 38 million gallons of water that would otherwise have been used in the production of paper. The plant can recycle glass, plastic, aluminum, steel and virtually any kind of paper, including cardboard (AW&RPR).

Alpine Waste & Recycling is the largest privately held commercial waste and recycling collection company in the Denver area. Founded in 1999 as a single-truck operation the company has earned the status as one of the top 25 fastest growing Colorado companies. AW&R processes 120,000 tons of waste and recyclable material per year. It is also the first company in Colorado to process recycling material competitively on a single-stream basis.
